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# **Event Demographics**

Maternal health continues to be a struggle in this country. The statistics on maternal deaths are staggering amongst mothers in diverse, underserved populations. The mortality rate amongst Hispanic women continues to rise in the U.S, year to year. In 2020, the mortality rate increased up to 44% from the year before for Hispanic women, reports the CDC. For every 100,000 births, there were 18.2 deaths among Hispanic women, up from 12.6 in 2019. The mortality rate amongst Black women also continues to rise at alarming rates.

The CDC reports Black women are three times more likely to die from a pregnancy-related cause than non-Hispanic white women. In 2021, the maternal mortality rate for non-Hispanic Black women was 69.9 deaths per 100,000 live births. Most of these cases of maternal deaths are due to a shift in focus away from the mother to the baby, and more than 80% of these deaths are preventable.

Contributing to this mounting public health issue are challenges such as a lack of education and resources in low-income areas, disparities in prenatal and maternal care, a lack of provider support to new mothers, an increase in postpartum depression and anxiety, and a measurable inequity in healthcare for mothers in underserved communities. Differences in health insurance coverage and access to care play a role in driving worse maternal and infant health outcomes for people of color.
